
1. Purpose. To notify all levels within the Marine Corps Recruiting Command, the relationship of Office of Personnel Management (OPM) and the United States Investigations Services (USIS) for all EPSQ/SF-86 submissions.

2. Background. References (a) and (b) outline the procedural guidelines for submission of all EPSQ/SF-86 work to OPM, from the Defense Security Services (DSS). This was mandated by DOD memorandums to alleviate a backlog of clearance requests within DOD. All MCRC investigation requests have been forwarded to OPM since 1 May 2001.

3. Information. The United States Investigations Service (USIS) conducts all clearance investigations on EPSQ/SF-86 work forwarded to OPM. Investigators are Federal Officers, who are tasked with conducting local agency checks, and conducting interviews with applicants, employers and references. All USIS investigators carry badges and credentials, and will present these credentials prior to conducting any investigative work. Investigators will arrange for interviews (if necessary), with members of the Delayed Entry Program. OPM/USIS has been notified when possible to arrange for these interviews be conducted at home, schools (with prior permission) or RS/RSS facilities. This scenario will provide an atmosphere that is safe, confidential, and controlled.

4. Action. All levels of MCRC (RS/RSS/PCS) should be made aware of the contents of this Frost Call. No member of MCRC will deny access to any USIS agent performing official duties of conducting investigations on members of the DEP.
